A Mission of Transformation

Terranjos Foundation is a non-profit non-governmental organisation dedicated to providing free, life-changing services to physically challenged children and young adults with disabilities such as Downs Syndrome, Cerebral palsy, Autism and other special needs.

Our mission is to ensure that every child, regardless of their financial background, has access to care which helps them lead normal lives. Such care includes physical therapy, social integration, speech therapy, educational support and parental guidance.

Our vision is to provide care for those around us with special needs in a homely and safe environment. Supporting them to have a good quality of life as much as possible and helping them achieve goals in life that they would not necessarily achieve if they were not in a supported environment such as Terranjos.

Our aim is to not only house and support children and young people with special needs, but to equip them with the valuable skills they need to become self-sufficient and respectable members of society.

Since our humble beginnings in 2021 with just three children, we have experienced exponential growth, now serving 95 children and counting, with the unwavering support of 24 dedicated staff members, physicians, therapists and allied health professionals.

At Terranjos Foundation, we are not just providing therapy and education; we are changing the future for children with disabilities. At the centre of clinical care, staff are supported by a multidisciplinary clinical team.

Our Mission

At Terranjos Foundation, our mission is simple yet profound: to provide every child with a disability the opportunity to thrive through access to therapy, education and holistic care—at no cost to their families.

Since our launch in 2021, we have grown from three children and 3 members of staff to 95 children receiving specialised support from a dedicated team of 24 therapists, caregivers and educators.

Our impact is felt every day through:

- Physical therapy that improves mobility and independence
- Speech and cognitive therapy to help the children communicate
- Educational programs that empower children with essential skills
- Family support initiatives to guide parents on their journey

Our Purpose

We believe in measurable impact. Our work is driven by real results and **Stories of Transformation** such as:

✓ Aisha (4, Cerebral Palsy) – Gained mobility and can now crawl and sit on her own.

✓ David (7, Down Syndrome) – Overcame speech delays and now communicates confidently.

✓ Emmanuel's Journey: Learning to Walk Again

Emmanuel was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at age two. His parents were heartbroken when doctors told them he might never walk. However, after 12 months of therapy at Terranjos Foundation, Emmanuel has taken his first steps, bringing immense joy to his family and caregivers.

✓ Yinka's Progress: Finding Her Voice

Diagnosed with autism, Yinka struggled with communication. Through consistent speech therapy and social integration programs, she has gone from non-verbal to confidently expressing her thoughts using assistive communication tools.

✓ In addition, we have provided over 2,000 hours of therapy since our inception and 350 hours of family psychosocial therapy.

Our 2025 Goals

Sustaining Specialised Care

We will continue offering free therapy and rehabilitation and enhanced learning support, supported by our multidisciplinary clinical team through

- Qualified therapists and caregivers
- Personalised therapy sessions
- Parent support programs

We will continue to ensure our staff obtain world class training as they also learn from and improve upon past experiences.

Facility Expansion

We are operating at maximum capacity in our current space which is too small for the increasing number of children.

A new facility will provide:

- More therapy rooms for one-on-one care
- More furnished classrooms
- A Sensory integration room
- A Specialised learning centre
- Kitchen facilities
- Staff accommodation
- A Training room

Essential Equipment and Furniture

In continuance of our specialist care and support for our clients and to make for an enhanced learning experience and better outcomes, we urgently need:

- Mobility aids (wheelchairs, walkers, standing frames)
- Therapy mats and sensory tools
- Adaptive seating and classroom furniture
- Equipment for vocational training

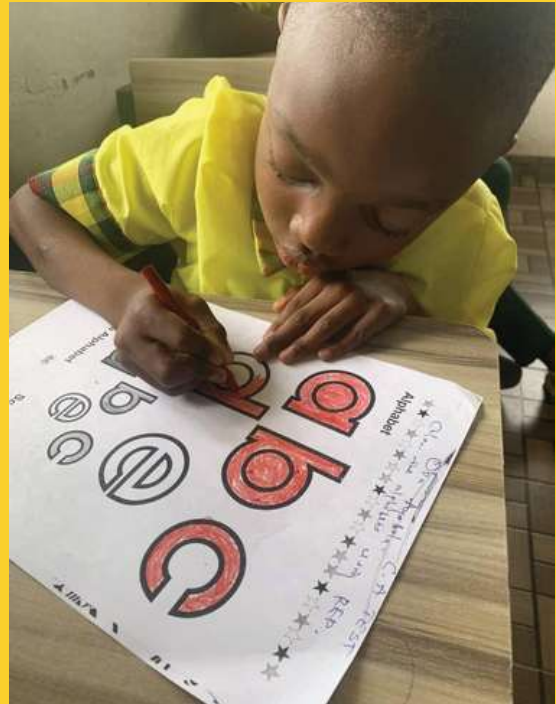

At its heart, Colour Day is about joyful learning—where education and play go hand in hand.

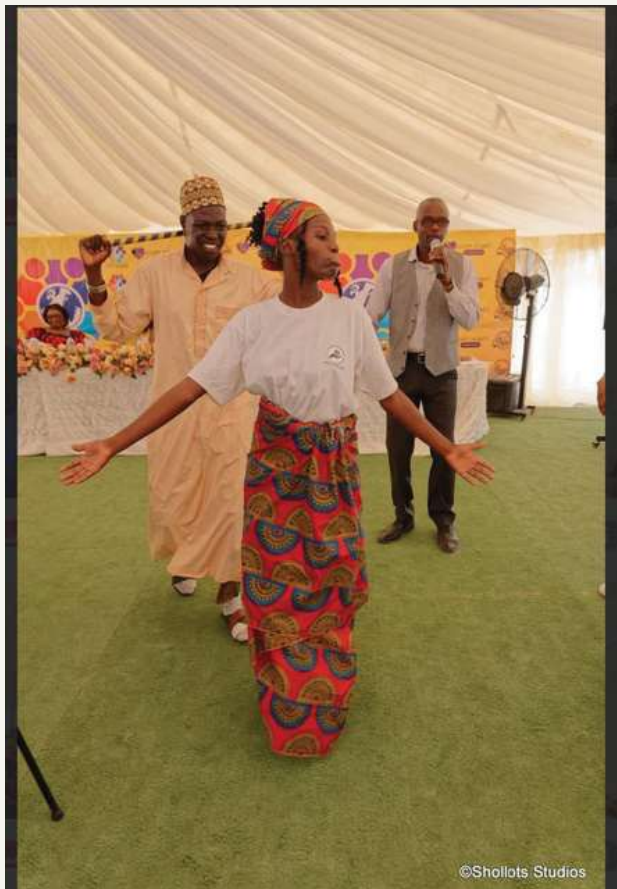

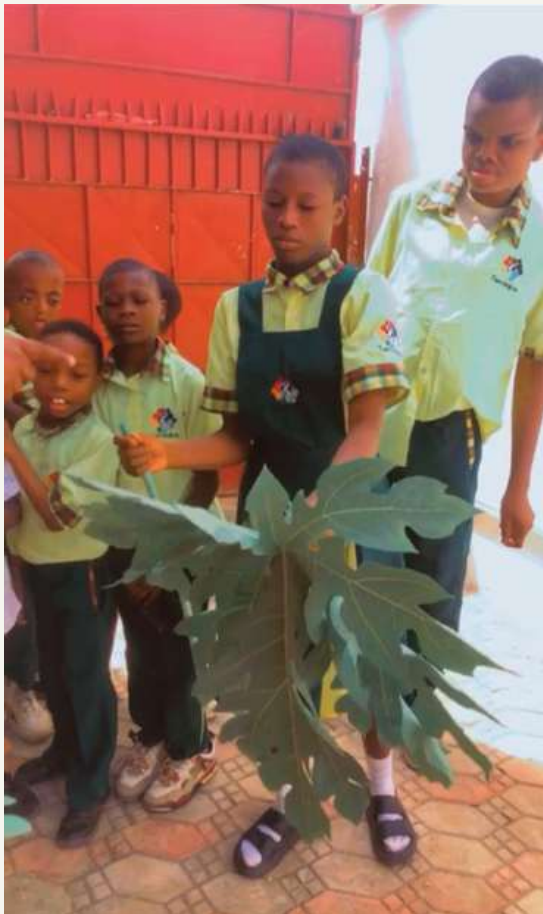

DANIEL

From infancy to the age of two, Daniel had a well-rounded developmental milestone . By the age of two, he could recite letters A-Z and could do other age-appropriate activities. Suddenly, he began to regress.

I sought for medical and spiritual interventions when the challenge started. Out of 40 special schools available in Oyo state, not a single school admitted children with Autism. I became overwhelmed with the issue of having to pay exorbitant fees to some of the schools who agreed to accept him. The fees were so expensive that I could not afford to pay.

After several searches for a special school, I was later referred to Terranjos Foundation. The first time I set my feet at the facility, I was amazed at the conducive environment, infrastructure and hospitality of the staff.

Having made all inquiries from the Director, I discovered that there was no need to make any payment – no tuition, no fees except for uniform and some textbooks.

Honestly, I was awed with the free services provided by the organisation. In all my search, I have never come across any special school offering free services.

I am very impressed and satisfied with the quality of education and care my child receives. I pray the staff and management and their future generations reap the fruit of their labour

FRANCIS

We celebrate the remarkable achievements of Francis, a 3 year old boy with Cerebral Palsy. He was brought to our Centre at the age of 3 years old and has never walked before. After intensive physiotherapy sessions at the Centre, Francis has made tremendous progress in his physical abilities (gross motor skills) through continuous physiotherapy. He made significant improvements and is able to walk on his own.

Francis' success would not have been possible without the intervention of Terranjos. The physiotherapists support and guidance have been instrumental in helping him achieve this incredible milestone.

We are very proud of Francis. This achievement serves as a reminder that with the right support and therapy, individuals with special needs can overcome challenges and reach their full potential.

Terranjos Foundation provides the best psychological and therapeutic support to individuals living with neurodevelopmental conditions. In addition, the day care services Francis received was very effective. Our health care assistants ensured he was well taken care of.

Parents Testimonies

I was reluctant to speak at first but felt the urge to do so after I heard another parent speak. I gave birth to a set of twins at a very young age. But one of them had Cerebral Palsy. I had to stay at home with my child who is living with Cerebral Palsy while everyone goes to school or work. I found it difficult to do any other thing because my son needed attention and constant care.

At some point I looked out for special schools where I can put my son, I could not find a suitable one. It's either they rejected him or the environment is not clean. Some had overgrown bushes that can harbour dangerous reptiles.

I became dejected and sad. On a fateful day, I was at my shop when I eventually got referred to Terranjos Foundation by a neighbour. When I got to the facility, I became scared and wondered how on earth I will be able to afford the school fees. This was because the building and surrounding looked so beautiful, serene and clean. I thought the fees will be so high.

After the conversation with the Director, I found out the services are FREE. No school fees or tuition. No hidden fees.

After some time, I was called to resume with my ward. Ever since then it has been wonderful. My son now makes attempts to feed himself. He also goes through Physiotherapy at the Centre. Now, he looks so bright and happy.

Iyanu is a 20 year old boy that was brought to the Centre by his parents. He has mild Autism and a learning disability. He started attending Music lessons at our Centre. Through rigorous training and dedication he has demonstrated remarkable talent and perseverance in mastering the keyboard.

Iyanu who has a moderate learning disability developed the skills to play the keyboard independently, showcasing exceptional hand-eye coordination and fine motor control. This accomplishment is a testament to Iyanu's hardworking, passion and resilience.

Under the guidance of the Foundations' music teacher, Iyanu has made tremendous progress learning complex pieces and techniques, playing the keyboard has not only brought Iyanu immense joy, it also provided a platform for self-expression, creativity and confidence building.

This achievement serves as an epitome of what can be accomplished with the right support, training and mindset as we strongly believe that there is ability in every disability.

Iyanu's passion and dexterity in playing the musical instruments motivated other learners to participate in the music lesson.

Community Outreach



The centre has been a vital support system for parents, providing reliable day care services that allow them to focus on their daily work with peace of mind. Many beneficiaries expressed gratitude for the free services, which included blood pressure checks, health education and referrals for follow-up care.

Led by experienced health professionals, the training equipped our staff with up-to-date skills and confidence to respond promptly and effectively in emergencies.

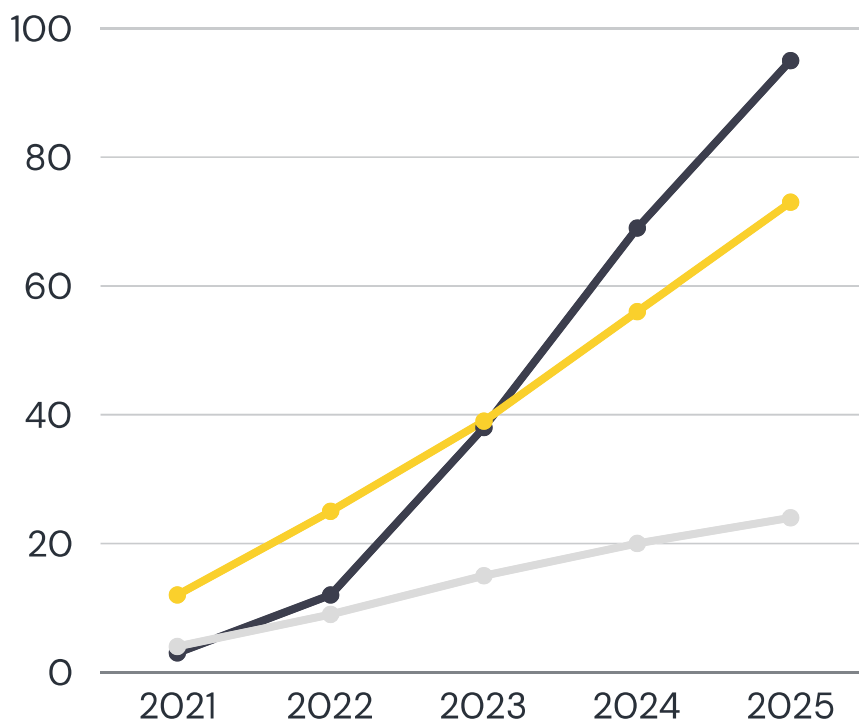


This proactive initiative not only enhances our crisis preparedness but also provides peace of mind to parents, knowing that their children are cared for by a team that is ready to act in any situation.
